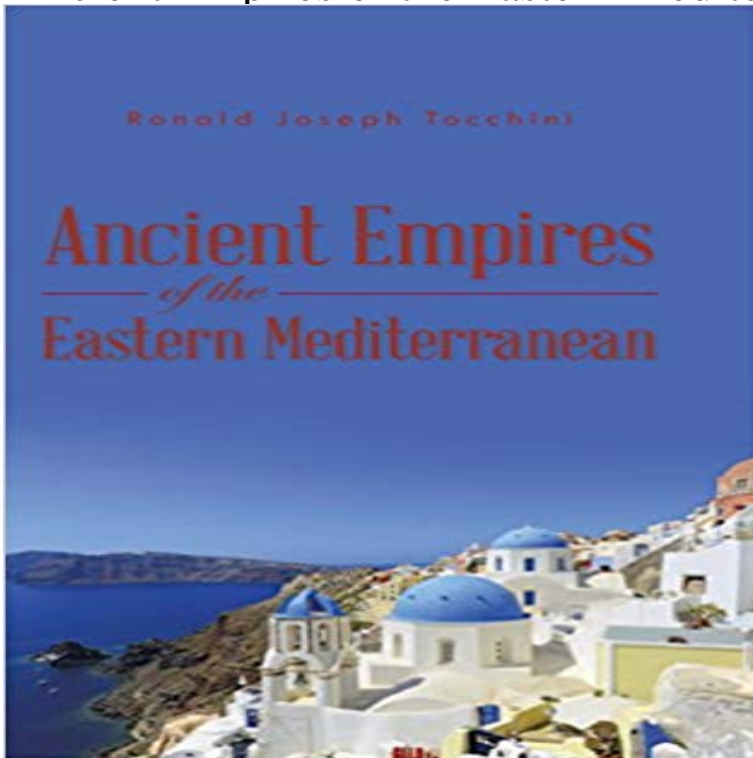


## Ancient Empires of the Eastern Mediterranean
